<b>What is Geography?</b>	Complete a spider diagram with words connected to Geography. Make sure you identify the difference between physical and human geography. <b>Jobs related to Geography.</b>	Complete a spider diagram of all the jobs that you think would have something to do with Geography.	For each of the jobs that you have included in your mind map write a short description for each one explaining why it is something to do with Geography.	Choose at least one of the jobs and write a detailed description of the job and the different things that a person doing this job might do. Perhaps you could research on line actual examples of these jobs.	
<b>Geography on the TV</b>	Watch a Geography related programme on TV and list at least five geographical facts you found out.	Summarise the programme in your own words.	Summarise the programme in your own words and then state the link between the programme and Geography.	
<b>Areas of Geographical Interest within the UK (physical and human)</b>	Find out the names of five places of geographical interest in the UK that are physical geography and five places of geographical interest in the UK that are human Geography.
