



SCHOOL UNIFORM LIST 2015

YEARS 7 – 11

The school uniform described below has been approved by the School Governors in consultation with parents, students and staff. Students are expected to wear their uniform with pride as ambassadors for the school. The correct uniform should be worn on all school occasions unless otherwise directed by members of staff. **Shirts should be worn tucked into trousers or skirts.**

The school colours are black, red and silver. The school badge is a silver crown.

The uniform is made up of the following items:

BLAZER*	A blazer which is stylish and functional with a fitted design for girls. Each blazer has the KHS crown already embroidered onto the pocket. Compulsory for all girls and boys and only available from KHS.
TROUSERS or SKIRT	Tailored, plain black polyester viscose. Should have a plain waistband. Should NOT have flares which extend over the shoe. Should NOT touch or drag on the floor. Should NOT have decorations, bows, adornments, or stitched creases. Plain black polyester viscose. The skirt should be neither excessively long, nor excessively short (a useful guide is 4 inches (10cm) from the floor when kneeling). It should be practical for wearing around school and without decorations, bows, adornments, belts or slits. <u>A school skirt which meets these guidelines is available from our school uniform shop.</u> Stretch fabric, clingy and pleated skirts are NOT allowed. Belts, if worn, should be of a conventional narrow type, black, threaded through loops with an unobtrusive buckle.
SHIRT or BLOUSE	Long or short sleeved, plain white polyester cotton to be worn with our school tie, buttoned to neck with enough material allowance to stay tucked into waistband.
SCHOOL TIE*	Black, red and silver stripes, including a house colour stripe. Clip on tie to be worn with top button done up. Compulsory for all girls and boys and only available from KHS.
SOCKS or TIGHTS	Plain black or white ankle socks or tights.
SHOES	Plain black (not suede/no logos) traditional school shoes. All footwear must be suitable for the school environment. In the interests of health and safety, high heels, open toe, sling-backs, platforms, canvas, training shoes or boots are not permitted for use around school.

The following items are optional additions to the uniform:

OUTDOOR COAT	Any outdoor coat which is worn should be plain, without graffiti or badges. No denim, leather, suede, or hooded, sweatshirt-type tops/jackets. The purpose of the outer coat is to afford protection from adverse weather conditions, i.e., rain. If pupils are walking or cycling to school, we advise the use of safety armlets or stick-ons.
SCARF	School approved design in KHS colours.
SWEATER	Plain black, v-necked Full length sleeve and body. Cropped sweaters are <u>not</u> permitted.

HAIRSTYLES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students with long hair should tie it back. Extreme and/or exhibitionist hair-styles are not permitted, eg hair dyed red, closely shaven hair. Boys are to be clean-shaven, at least until the Sixth Form.
JEWELLERY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Jewellery must not be worn to school. For health and safety reasons, earrings or studs may not be worn in school. Students wishing to pierce their ears, or other parts of their anatomy, should arrange to have it done in the holidays, leaving adequate time for healing and daytime removal of jewellery in order to comply with school rules.
MAKE-UP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The use of make-up is not permitted for students.

P.E. KIT

The following items are common to boys/ girls PE kit:

TRAINING SHOES	Suitable for sport <u>not</u> fashion
JOGGING BOTTOMS	Optional item but recommended. Plain black polyester cotton, or with white trim. These can be used for warming up in cold weather at the discretion of the teacher.
SWEATSHIRT	Optional item. Plain black polyester cotton, crew neck – Sports College black sweatshirts available from school.
SWIMMING CAP	To be worn by pupils with long hair at the discretion of the PE teacher.

In addition to the above,

GIRLS will also need:

POLO SHIRT*	Compulsory white Sports College, 100% cotton, polo shirt with logos – only available from school.
SHORTS / SKORTS	Plain black sports shorts or skort (cotton or polyester)
LEGGINGS / FOOTLESS TIGHTS	Plain black – for dance/gymnastics in Years 7, 8 and 9.
SOCKS	White ankle socks. Kineton High School official black with red tops for hockey.
SHIN PADS	Recommended for hockey.
SWIMMING COSTUME	One piece, suitable for swimming not sunbathing.
GUM SHIELD	Recommended for hockey.

BOYS will also need:

POLO SHIRT*	Compulsory white Sports College, 100% cotton, polo shirt with logos – purchased directly from school.
SHORTS	Plain black cotton or nylon. Brief type underpants or swimming trunks underneath as these give more support. Boxer shorts are not advisable.
RUGBY SHIRT	Black with reverse side red pattern and white collar.
SHIN PADS	These are compulsory for rugby, football and hockey.
GUM SHIELD	These are advisable for rugby and hockey. Available from most sports shops and dentists.
SWIMMING TRUNKS	Designed for swimming rather than as fashion wear.
SOCKS	Kineton High School official black with red tops. White ankle socks for summer and gym work.
RUGBY OR FOOTBALL	Screw-in safety studs or moulded rubber studs are recommended for football and rugby.

We advise you to name items of clothing with a tag or permanent markers.

NB* These items are only available from school

VALUABLES IN P.E. LESSONS

During PE lessons, it is vital that watches and other valuables are handed in to the member of staff. This is for personal safety whilst participating and for the safety of the items.

All items handed in must be named clearly. It is a good idea to have initials engraved on the back of a watch. Whilst every precaution is taken for the safe-keeping of watches, it is up to the students to collect them at the end of the lesson or at the end of the day.

ART & DESIGN, DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY, SCIENCE

In the interests of health and safety all students are expected to wear protective clothing as directed by each department. In Design & Technology areas, aprons will be provided.

SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR TRIPS/EVENTS

Clothing worn on school trips will be determined at the time by the member of staff organising the trip, after consultation with the Headteacher. There may be times when activities require students to wear the same items of uniform e.g. school concerts.

UNIFORM SALES

To help parents economise, we sell second-hand uniform. This includes blazers, trousers, shirts, jumpers, PE kit and school ties. If you have any queries, please contact the School Office.

SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

Sixth Formers do not wear uniform, but are required to adhere to a 'Dress Code', details of which are available in our separate Sixth Form Prospectus.

GENERAL

- We would ask that students bring moderately sized bags to school, and avoid the very large types that can cause 'traffic' and storage problems in a school.
- Valuable items and significant amounts of money should not be brought to school. If a student must bring such items to school, they should arrange with their Form Tutor for its safe-keeping. The school has no insurance policy to cover the loss or theft of personal property.
