Head's message

Dear Parents/Carers,

At present, we are reviewing our whole school 'Marking and Feedback' guidance and the expectations for our teachers and students. Having been an English teacher for nearly 30 years I have marked, assessed, graded and commented on thousands of pieces of work. I have felt the delight and at times frustration that all teachers feel when they pick up an exercise book to see whether a student has understood the topic or applied their learning effectively; moreover, whether he or she has taken pride in their work.

I was delighted to have an opportunity to cover some GCSE English lessons recently and it was a pleasure to mark a set of Year 10 books in which students were clearly learning and applying their knowledge with great effort and effect.

There is much research about the impact of marking and feedback on students' progress. Perhaps the most powerful, being the Education Endowment Foundation's research into the most effective strategies to impact on the pace of students' learning. Perhaps surprisingly, 'Feedback' has the highest impact of all strategies, more than class size, homework and one to one tuition.

The teaching profession has recognised that simply ticking or grading work is not helpful if these are the only activities undertaken by the teacher. They help us monitor and check books or illustrate whether a student can apply knowledge or recall it in a test or assessment. The most important and effective feedback are the comments made by the teacher that help a student move forward with their learning and address misunderstandings. These may be verbal or written. Of course, looking at students' work crucially, enables us to plan our next lessons and address anything that hasn't been made clear.

It is vital therefore that students have the chance to respond to teachers' comments and to demonstrate they have moved forward as a result. At Kineton, we ask our students to respond to teachers' suggestions by using a green pen so that when they come to revise, they can see where their weaknesses were. You may see examples of FAR marking (feedback, action, response) which is aimed at helping students move forward. Below are some examples:



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
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Head's message

How can you help?

- Instead of asking your children what they got in a test or assessment, ask them what feedback they got from their teacher.
- Check that their exercise books show they've acted on the 'actions' suggested by their teachers. Look for the green pen.
- Ask them about the next steps they need to take to improve further.
- Reward their effort rather than their grades.
- Take the stance that mistakes are vital to learn effectively. The best learners don't get put off by obstacles and problems!



Finally, this week some of our Year 7 Students have been completing their Resistant Materials practical projects. They had to design and make a wire loop/buzz game and we are so impressed with the incredible work they have done.

British Biology Olympiad

Good luck to all A' level Biology students taking part in the upcoming British Biology Olympiad 2020.

The BBO challenges and motivates students with an interest in Biology and allows them to demonstrate their knowledge by offering a wide ranging syllabus.



The competition will take place during lessons between 31st January and 7th February, and consists of two 45-minute multiple choice online tests.

Top scoring students are rewarded with publicly recognised certificates and will be offered the opportunity to attend an awards ceremony. The BBO also provides a means of selecting a team to represent the UK at the International Biology Olympiad.

Senior Maths Challenge

On Thursday 7th November, we had a large number of our Sixth Form students take part in the annual Senior Maths Challenge.



The challenge consists of a 90 minute exam paper with a range of questions designed to stretch the most able sixth form mathematicians across the country. Questions are not presented like they are in A-level exam papers – they require logical thinking, understanding of abstract concepts and the ability to spot patterns and links across a number of difficult topics.

We recently received the results and were pleased that we had 9 students achieving a bronze certificate, 4 achieving silver and Shane in year 12 managed to achieve the gold certificate, as well as qualifying for the additional 'Kangaroo' round. This is a very impressive feat as only students scoring in the top 25% in the Senior Maths Challenge are eligible to take part.

A huge congratulations to Shane and all of the students that entered the challenge.

Department for Education statistics show that students with 100% attendance are 2.2 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs at 9-5 including English and Maths than pupils with lower than 90% attendance. Every day and every lesson matters!

'We know parents try wherever possible to not have medical appointments during the school day in order to avoid missed lesson time and a reduction in school attendance. However we appreciate this is not always avoidable, therefore please try to book appointments using student social times, such as between 10.30-12.30am mark which will use break and lunchtime and therefore minimises lost lesson times. This can ensure that students are in school for the other 4 lessons and only missing part of one lesson, rather than loosing morning or afternoon lessons. Thank you for your on-going support with this.'

Student Absence Procedure

If your child is unwell and cannot attend school please call the 24 hour Absence Line on 01926 645 611 before 8.50am, stating their name and form, your name and the reason. This must be done for each day they will be absent.

If your child is unable to attend school for any reason other than illness, planned or emergency (part day, full day or multiple days), please always complete a leave of absence form and send it by email to enquiries@kinetonhighschool.org.uk This form should - we all need to play our part. be used for all appointments (medical, dental, music exams or external sporting activities), holiday requests, religious observance dates and all other reasons or circumstances where your child will be absent from school.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the arrangements. parent(s).

Unauthorised Absence

There are times when children are absent for reasons, which are not permitted by law. Examples of unauthorised absence are parental illness, term time . holidays or a family day out. Where there is no explanation for an absence or where the explanation or reason for the absence is considered unsatisfactory absence will be recorded as 'unauthorised'. Unauthorised Absences have to be reported to the Local Authority. The Attendance Compliance Enforcement Team may contact you where unauthorised absence continues to be a problem. Unauthorised absence could result in a Fixed Penalty Fine or other legal action. We are always concerned about the amount of school time pupils miss as a result of term time leave. There is no entitlement to time off during term time. Leave of absence is only granted in The full Attendance policy can be found under exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the Headteacher in accordance with the school policy as agreed by the governing body.

We greatly appreciate parental support to reduce the total amount of days lost due to holidays. We are committed to working in partnership with you to enable your child to reach their academic targets and to support their social development. For this to happen we need to keep individual attendance as high as possible

It is our policy:

- Only in an exceptional circumstance will term time leave be allowed. Parents/Carers wishing to apply for leave of absence need to fill in an application form well in advance and before booking tickets or making travel
- If term time leave is taken without prior permission from the school, the absence will be unauthorised and you may be liable for a fixed-penalty fine or other legal action.
- Please remember that absence for whatever reason disadvantages a child by creating gaps in his/her learning. A good understanding of the work and good progress can only take place when the child is in the classroom regularly and on time.

If you think you have exceptional circumstances please talk to us without delay and before arrangements are entered into or money committed. If exceptional circumstances are accepted the Headteacher will determine how much absence will be authorised. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Leave of Absence During Term Time 2019-20



The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the Where applications for leave of absence are made in case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time.
